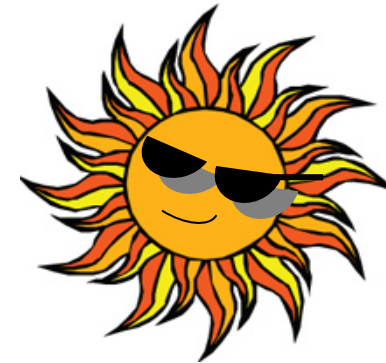

ART THROUGH THE AGES

Teacher: Mr. Maguire

Students will explore how history has shaped art throughout time. We will literally take a "hands-on" approach by emulating the style and materials used to create art throughout the ages. From cave paintings to papyrus scrolls, Japanese drama masks to modern art and photography; each day will be a step back in time. Don't forget your camera and your imagination. 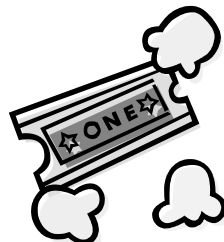

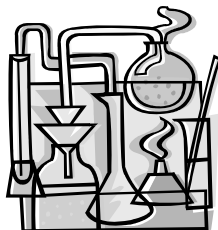

Please note the following:

- A minimum number of students is required for each course to be held. Enrollment may be limited. Registrations will be accepted on a first-come, first-served, basis and are not complete until payment is received. Haddonfield students have priority until May 1st.
- A non-refundable registration fee of \$25 is included in the cost of each session. If a registration must be withdrawn prior to June 1st, the tuition will be refunded minus the non-refundable registration fee.
- *A limited number of scholarships are available for students with financial need.* Scholarship requests must be submitted by e-mail to your building principal and approved before registering electronically.
